



Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) Program Information

Does psychology, counseling, social work, education, and organizational management interest you? Do you want to teach people skills that can make a difference to them for the rest of their lives, by giving them the tools to interact with the world around them? Then Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) may be for you. Testing and Training International (TTI) is now facilitating a Post-Master's degree in Applied Behavior Analysis in conjunction with Daemen College.

As a Behavior Analyst, you will implement and evaluate environmental modifications, and arrange stimuli and consequences, to produce socially significant improvement in human behavior using direct observation, measurement, and functional analysis of the relationship between environment and behavior.

Our program will provide comprehensive training in Applied Behavior Analysis, an intervention approach commonly used with individuals with autism spectrum or related disorders, but can be used with anyone who is in need of and consents to behavior change. Students who complete our program will develop the practical skills and knowledge needed to provide behavioral health treatment for anyone who could benefit from behavioral intervention, including people with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD), Down Syndrome, ADHD, addictions, Dementia, and people who are typically developing (e.g., staff, students, consumers, caregivers).

Program Design

Our program, custom designed by Daemen College and TTI, features separate men's and women's cohorts with classes online scheduled around *Yomim Tovim* and the Jewish calendar. This program combines online classes and supervised field work for a robust academic experience.

The ABA program's mission is to prepare students to practice Behavior Analysis. Students will be prepared to sit for the exam to become a BCBA® (Board Certified Behavior Analyst).

ABA Program Prerequisites

- Students will have completed or nearly completed a Master's degree in Education, Psychology, or Behavior Analysis from an accredited college or university.
- Students will submit two letters of recommendation, preferably including one professional reference and 1 character reference.
- Students will participate in a personal interview.
- Students will provide a written statement describing personal and educational goals and objectives.
- Students will provide a copy of a current resume, including all certifications and licensures.

Additional Program Requirements

- Students enrolled in the ABA Course Sequence must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above (on a 4.00 scale).
- The ABA Program Director will notify the Graduate Committee on Academic Standards if a student falls below a 3.0 grade point average.
- Students who receive a course grade below 3.0 may repeat said course one time; failure to achieve a 3.0 on the second attempt will be grounds for academic dismissal.
- The actions of students who engage in academic dishonesty within program coursework will be reviewed by the Graduate Committee on Academic Standards in accordance with Daemen College Policy.

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) is a course designed to provide the student with an understanding of the Concepts and Principles that underlie the science of ABA. The historical and philosophical background of ABA will be covered and students will learn about the essential elements of ABA. An introduction to behavioral measurement will be provided in the context of some basic behavior change methods. Additionally, students will be introduced to the Laws, Rules, and Regulations regarding the practice of ABA.

BCBA Job Outlook

- According to a 2015 report conducted for the Behavior Analyst Certification Board, the demand for behavior analyst positions more than doubled from 2012 to 2014. The U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics projects that employment in the psychology field, which includes behavior analyst positions, will grow 22 percent from 2014 to 2024, a rate much faster than the average for all occupations.
- Typically, behavior analysts are employed in school districts, clinics, hospitals, group homes, agencies, and manage their own private practices.
