DIRFloortime® is a revolutionary approach to identifying, preventing and treating developmental and learning disorders in young children, especially those on the autism spectrum. It focuses on social-emotional functioning as the basis for all other aspects of development, and on relationships as the vehicles for promoting children's capacities to relate, communicate and think. DIR® is a **D**evelopmental, **I**ndividual-differences, & **R**elationship-based approach which has become the foundation for understanding child development and providing support and intervention to help children reach their fullest potential. DIRFloortime® (also known as Floortime) uses the DIR® foundation to provide an intervention for children with Autism and other mental health and developmental disabilities that has been shown through research and practice to be very effective.

This is a progressive assessment-based certificate program which means that you must successfully complete one course at a time to progress to the next. As an assessment-based certificate program, each participant's Floortime skills are assessed using an assessment rubric and each participant must earn a passing rating in order to earn the official certificate.

### More information about Floortime Therapy

- Floortime therapy, as part of a proposed treatment plan, must be determined by a QHP (Qualified Healthcare Professional) capable of making a diagnosis of autism. Providers must meet license qualification determined by each state.
- Floortime is an alternative to ABA and is sometimes used in combination with ABA therapies.
- Different types of professionals seek special training in Floortime techniques, including (but not limited to):
  - Child psychologists
  - Special education teachers
  - Speech therapists
  - Occupational therapists
- All Medicaid plans must cover treatments that are medically necessary for children under the age of 21. If a doctor recommends Floortime and says it is medically necessary for your child, Medicaid must cover the cost. (source: Autismspeaks.org)
- Taking care of a child with autism can be overwhelming at times, but there are services available to help. Effective July 1, 2020, Horizon NJ Health covers medically necessary DIR (Developmental, Individual-differences and Relationship-based model) services for children diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). DIR services are clinical services intended to help providers understand how each person individually perceives and interacts with their environment and how this contributes to their social-emotional development. The need for DIR services must be determined by a health care professional who is qualified to make an autism diagnosis. DIR services require prior authorization. (source: HorizonNJHealth.com)
- Occupational therapy, speech therapy, and mental health appointments can receive varying amounts of out-of-network insurance coverage dependent on the insurance provider and the insurance plan's out-of-network coverage.

### Course Outcomes
